PLAYER'S CODE

- Play the game for the game sake.
- Be generous when you win.
- Be graceful when you lose.

PARENT'S CODE

- Attempt to relieve the pressure of competition, not increase it. A child is easily affected by outside influences.
- Be kind to your child's coach and to officials. They are volunteers giving of personal time and money to provide a recreational activity for your child.
- Your opponents are necessary friends. Without them, your child could not participate. Applaud good plays by your team and by members of the opposing team.
- Between the exuberance of the winner and the disappointment of the loser, we find a person called a referee. All of them follow the same creed to watch every move of every player and to call the game to the best of his/her ability. Do not openly question his/her judgment and never the honesty. He/She is a symbol of fair play, integrity and sportsmanship.
- Accept the results of each game. Encourage your child to: Be gracious in victory, and turn defeat to victory by working toward improvements.

COACH'S CODE

- Maintain self-control

- Do not use profanity, offensive language, or any inappropriate action
- Use of alcoholic beverages prior to or during sporting events is prohibited
- Use of tobacco products during sporting events is prohibited
- Do not raise your voice in anger and refrain from arguments
- Do not verbally abuse officials, coaches, players or any other person in attendance

- Play hard, play fair and always respect the spirit of the game

Violation of the Code of Conduct

Any individual that is reported in violation may be asked to leave by a FSA Representative will serve a mandatory minimum of 1 game suspension, which includes exclusion from the Fairfield Sports playing area. This means they are not allowed to remain on premises or in the parking area during the duration of the game. Severe violations will be reviewed by the FSA committee and result in multiple weeks of suspension, up to suspension from involvement in the league.
